

NOTES FOR TEACHERS

This multimedia GCSE Geography Resource pack is designed to accompany the *London, Sugar and Slavery* exhibition at the *Museum in Docklands* and provide teachers with a PowerPoint presentation, set of ready to use worksheets and the inspiration to stimulate learning and excite students in the classroom. It aims to achieve this through developing a detailed case study of *Sugar and Slavery in Barbados* and looks at some of the changes that the island has experienced since the early seventeenth century. It would be ideally suited to Years 9-11, depending on ability.

Contents:

(1) PowerPoint presentation

This presentation runs automatically to authentic Caribbean music. To start the presentation, you simply click the first slide which will then set the presentation into motion. It is designed like this so that the opening slide can be on the screen at the beginning of a lesson. The presentation lasts 9 minutes.

(2a) Worksheet

This worksheet accompanies the PowerPoint presentation and is best completed collectively as a class after having watched the presentation. This provides the students with a detailed set of comprehensive notes. The blank gaps enable students to recall information that they have gleaned from the presentation.

(2b) Worksheet Answers

These are provided for the benefit of teachers.

(3a) Practise Exam Question

This practise exam question is based on the style of a GCSE structured data response question and encourages students to individually apply the knowledge they have gleaned from watching the PowerPoint presentation and completing the worksheet. This resource is designed so that question 5 can be included for brighter students or left out should it be considered too challenging. It could potentially be an extension question.

(3b) Practise Exam Question Mark Scheme

This is provided for the benefit of teachers. Where responses are assessed using a level response marking system, the following general criteria should be used:

Level 1: Basic - Knowledge of basic information; simple understanding; little organisation; few links; little or no detail; uses a limited range of specialist terms and exemplary material; and reasonable accuracy in the use of spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Level 2: Clear - Knowledge of accurate information; clear understanding; organised answers with some linkages; occasional detail; good range of specialist terms and exemplary material where appropriate; and considerable accuracy in spelling, punctuation and grammar.

(4a) Crossword

This is designed as a quick and fun activity which tests the basic knowledge of the case study material.

(4b) Crossword Answers

These are provided for the benefit of teachers.
