

BUILDING... *a better railway*

A new flyunder comes into service on 24 August

As part of DLR's Investment Programme works, a new DLR service will be in place from 24 August which will include the operation of our new flyunder track at West India Quay station. Trains travelling from Bank towards Lewisham will use this track during weekday peak times, improving frequencies and journey times through this busy location.

Trains using the flyunder will not stop at West India Quay station.

Passengers wishing to alight at West India Quay are advised to change at Canary Wharf for a train towards Bank or Stratford.

This new flyunder will reduce journey times from Bank towards Lewisham

Completed work at West India Quay junction and the introduction of the new flyunder will provide a dedicated route for trains from Bank into Canary Wharf improving journey times.

These trains will not serve West India Quay station. However, all other services will continue to stop as usual.

Other service changes taking place will include:

- More frequent trains during weekday peak times between Tower Gateway–Beckton, Bank–Woolwich Arsenal and Bank–Lewisham.
- Services between Stratford–Lewisham will reduce to every seven minutes during weekday peak times and every 10 minutes between Stratford–Crossharbour during weekday late evenings.
- At weekends, train frequency doubles between Bank–Lewisham during daytime peak times. And all trains from Stratford will terminate at Canary Wharf.

First and last train times will also be modified. Check before you travel.

This timetable is the first step towards three-carriage services between Bank–Lewisham, which will begin in early 2010.

The flyunder will be in use between 06.09–09.36 and 15.39–19.06 weekdays
