

Teachers' notes

These resources have been developed to enable KS2 teachers and pupils to access a range of material from the Sainsbury Archive, held at the Museum in Docklands. They suggest ways in which the material can be used to support the National Curriculum requirements and QCA schemes of work for Literacy, Mathematics, Art and Design, Citizenship, Design and Technology, Geography, History, ICT, RE and Science (see **Curriculum links**).

Sainsbury Archive interactive presentation

This presentation has been designed to be used as an introduction to the Sainsbury Archive. It is intended to be teacher-led and can be used with an interactive whiteboard. It introduces themes that are reinforced and expanded upon elsewhere in the website.

Many of the questions in the presentation are designed to be open-ended and stimulate discussion and enquiry so they do not necessarily have a 'right' answer. Multiple choice questions are designed to encourage to discuss their ideas before clicking on an answer to see if they are correct and to find out more.

The separate teachers' notes to accompany the presentation provide additional information about each of the themes and suggestions for widening discussion. We suggest that you print these off to use in conjunction with the presentation.

After working as a class on the presentation, pupils can then explore the archive more fully - either individually, in pairs or small groups (see **Spotlight on food, shops and shopping, Classroom activities and Quizzes**).

Timeline

This provides a chronological framework, linking the development of Sainsbury's with national and world events. Illustrated with images from the Sainsbury Archive, it can be used with an interactive whiteboard or by pupils working on a computer. Alternatively you might like to download it and display it in the classroom.

Spotlight on food, shops and shopping

This resource enables pupils to examine photographs, objects and documentary evidence from the Sainsbury Archive. Through working with archive material in this way, it is hoped that pupils will gain an understanding of how to interpret it as evidence of life in Britain in the past and of life today.

The archive material is grouped into six different themes:

- the Victorians
- the Second World War
- Britain since the Second World War
- celebrations
- design and packaging
- where food comes from

Each theme is linked to different areas of the National Curriculum often integrating several subjects (see **Curriculum links**). After beginning with a generic introduction to the theme, pupils are directed to archive material and to interactive quizzes by following the links.

Classroom activities

These suggest ways in which the **Interactive presentation** can be followed up in the classroom. Each activity is designed as a separate lesson, linked to a specific subject. However, several tasks integrate different subject areas and so can also be used for cross-curricular teaching.

Scrapbook

The images in the scrapbook are intended to support the **Classroom activities**. They can be used with an interactive whiteboard or printed out onto paper or card to display in the classroom or be given to individual pupils.

Quizzes

There are six interactive quizzes, each linked to one of the **Spotlight** themes. Given the cross-curricular nature of this resource, some of the same questions appear in more than one quiz. Consequently it may not be appropriate for pupils to complete all six quizzes, but instead to focus on one or two themes.

The quizzes are designed for pupils to complete individually, in pairs or in small groups working on a computer, or as a whole class using an interactive whiteboard. They build on knowledge acquired in the **Interactive presentation** and are intended to reinforce and extend understanding. Some questions are deliberately designed to stretch pupils; by clicking on 'wrong' answers they are given further information which adds to their learning experience. Other questions have no 'right' or 'wrong' answers but are designed to encourage creativity.

The quizzes can be used independently of the **Spotlight** resource, or as a follow-up activity to reinforce knowledge.
